The culmination of the 2016-2017 season will be held March 17 to 19 on the Plains of Abraham in Québec City. TVA Sports will be the official French-language broadcaster of the event. Cross-country fans will therefore be able to follow the performances of the world's top skiers – including Québec's own Alex Harvey – live.

10 am: Pursuit (free technique) 10 km – Women's final 11:30 am: Pursuit (free technique) 15 km – Men's final

On March 5, at the world championships in Lahti, Finland, Alex Harvey became the first North American ever to win gold in the 50-kilometre freestyle cross-country race. He is currently 4th in the overall World Cup standings.
